Our weekly news sheet will continue and shall be delivered to those without internet access; and we have begun to explore how we might develop *e.church* as a space within our website to share reflections and more.

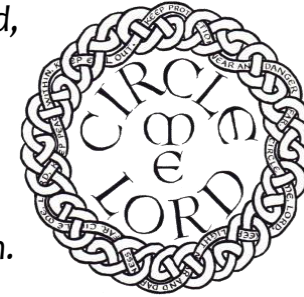
